## **Sermon Based Questions**



Date- Sunday 15 September 2019 Series- Greatest letter ever written prt 11

Salvation and loyalty to Israel
28 As far as the gospel is concerned, they are enemies for your sake; but as far as election is concerned, they are loved on account of the patriarchs, 29 for God's gifts and his call are irrevocable. Romans 11:28-29
1. Did God reject his people. Romans 11:1-10.
2. Did Israel fall beyond recovery. Romans 11:11-24.
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3. Salvation is a mystery- and one cannot be conceited. Romans 11:25-32.
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## A. Examining the texts.

- 1. Read Romans 11:1-10. Did God reject his people? What answer does Paul give to this question- and what does it say about him?
- 2. Read Romans 11:11-24. Did Israel fall beyond recovery? What was Paul's answer to this question and what reasons did Paul give?
- 3. Read Romans 11:25-32. In what sense is salvation a mystery? And also- what reason does Paul give for not being conceited to his audience?
- 4. Read Romans 11. Why is it important to consider both the kindness and sternness of God?

## B. Meditation & application

- 5. What does Gods patience with Israel tell us about covenant relationship with God? How does Christ demonstrate this reality?
- 6. Do you think it is possible to fall beyond recovery in the economy of God? What does this chapter have to say into this question?
- 7. When you think about Gods' dealings with Israel- how are you encouraged to stand firm in your faith? How does this inspire you toward faithfulness?
- 8. How does Christ demonstrate the relentless pursuit of sinful humanity? How is that story revealed in Gods dealings with Israel?
- 9. Salvation is a mystery. What makes salvation a mystery and how does Paul speak of it?
- 10. Gods love is relentless. Who have you given up on and how can you embody the relentless love of God with others in your life?
