Date- Sunday 25th Feb 24 Series: Knowing & Following 3

He who has an ear- Listen!

11 He told them, "The secret of the kingdom of God has been given to you. But to those on the outside everything is said in parables 12 so that, "they may be ever seeing but never perceiving, and ever hearing but never understanding, otherwise, they might turn and be forgiven!" - Mark 4:11-12

1. Jesus teaches in parables to reveal to those with ears. Vs 1-12.

2. The meaning of the parable Vs 13-20.

A. Examining the texts.

- 1. Read Mark 1:1-9. Why do you think Jesus says what he does in verse 9? What do you think he means?
- 2. Read Mark 1:10-12. What makes this part of the text difficult to understand and how does it speak to the purpose of teaching in parables?
- 3. Read Isaiah 6:8-13. What does this passage have to say about the effects of Isaiahs ministry and how is it in some way similar to that of Christ?
- 4. Read Mark 4:13-20. What does this explanation of the parable reveal about how people respond to the "sowing of the Kingdom?"

B. Meditation & application

- 5. "Parables both reveal and conceal." Discuss this statement?
- 6. Why do you think Jesus says what it does in verse 13? Why is this parable a key parable?
- 7. What goals does this parable give Gods people & what hindrances does the parable put forward as hindering a harvest?
- 8. How would this teaching have equipped the disciples for their future ministry of sowing seed?
