## **Explaining Pentecost: It's about Jesus**

36 "Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Messiah."

- 1. Pentecost is all about Jesus. Acts 2:14-36
- a. Pentecost as a fulfilment of prophecy (Acts 2:14-21)
- b. It's all about Jesus (Acts 2:22-28)
- c. God has made this Jesus, that you crucified both Lord and Messiah (Acts 2:29-36)
- 2. Repent and be baptized! Acts 2:29-37
- d. They were cut to the heart (Acts 2:37)
- e. Repent & be baptized (Acts 2:38)
- f. A promise for all (Acts 2:39)
- g. The gravity of the message- Save yourself! (Acts 2:40-41)
- e. A great harvest!

## A. Examining the texts.

- 1. Read Acts 2:13-21. Peter refutes the mockery of verse 13, by citing Joel. In what ways is Pentecost the fulfillment of these verses?
- 2. Read Acts 2:22-35. Why does Peter quote David in Acts 2:25-28 (Ps 16:8-11), and Acts 2:34-35 (Ps 110:1)?
- 3. Read Acts 2:22-36. What does Peter assert about Jesus in these verses and why was it impossible for death to keep its hold on Jesus?
- 4. Read Acts 2:37-41. What is the response of the crowd to Peters' preaching & what does he tell them to do? What do you think verse 39 means when it says 'those who are far off?"

## **B. Meditation & application**

- 5. How does Peter contrast Israels treatment of Jesus with Gods' treatment of Jesus?
- 6. Why do you think that Luke gives us statistic summaries at 2:41, 47, 4:4, 6:7, 9:31, 16:5) How is this in keeping with our key verse- Acts 1:8?
- 7. What does Peters address here reveal to us about what the gospel is and how it relates to the gift of the Spirit?
- 8. How does Peter display the empowering witness of the Spirit in his preaching?
