

Trial upon trial

28 Then Agrippa said to Paul, "Do you think that in such a short time you can persuade me to be a Christian?" 29 Paul replied, "Short time or long—I pray to God that not only you but all who are listening to me today may become what I am, except for these chains." Acts 26:28-29



- 2. Trial before Felix (Acts 24:1-21)
- 3. Trial before Festus (Acts 25:6-12)
- 4. Trial before Festus and Agrippa (Acts 26:32)
- 5. Paul is innocent (Acts 26:32)

A. Examining the texts.

- 1. Read Acts 23:23-35. What did Claudius arrange for Paul so that he could go and be tried by Felix? What did Claudius conclude about the charges against Paul? Vs 29
- 2. Read Acts 24:1-21. What charges were made against Paul and how did he defend himself to Felix?
- 3. Read Acts 25:6-12. What happened to Paul here and how did he defend himself to Festus?
- 4. Read Acts 25:23-26:32. How does Paul defend himself to Agrippa and in what does he pray for Agrippa and others who are present?

B. Meditation & application

- 5. How is Paul an example of resilient Christian mission and witness?
- 6. As we think about these three trials- what do we know about the gospel that Paul was preaching? How does his understanding of this gospel impact our own faith sharing?
- 7. How does Paul use his own testimony to defend himself and what role do you think personal testimony plays in our faith sharing?
- 8. How do you marry the idea that God promised to protect Paul and the idea that he also allowed Paul to suffer and have real trouble?
- 9. Paul had a lazer like focus on mission. How could we foster that kind of focus?
